Morning Program—Visiting Annunciation Catholic Academy—Technology and more...

You will experience what classroom teachers are using to integrate technology into Religion and into other subjects. You will have time during the conference schedule to begin to explore what it takes to plan for and implement technology in a classroom setting. Both Dr. Curran and Ms. Jones will be available to answer your questions on what it takes to integrate technology into the 21st Century Learning Experience.

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School Information

Annunciation Catholic Academy is a parish school committed to fulfilling the Church's mandate to teach the Gospel and the tenets of our Catholic faith. Guided by the Holy Spirit, the Academy strives to teach as Jesus taught and to affirm the values of living as Jesus lived. Annunciation Catholic Academy is committed to preparing its students to live out their faith in a global, technological society. Since our opening in 1996, the Academy has continued to thrive! We have graduated over 600 students who have gone on to excel in high school and universities across the nation.

During its relatively brief history, the Annunciation Catholic Academy has been recognized for its outstanding work in the field of Catholic education. In 1999 and again in 2002, the Academy was honored by the National Catholic Educational Association (NCEA) and Boston College for exemplary programs in technology integration and middle school advisories respectively. The School Board was recognized as a distinguished School Board by the NCEA in 2003, and the Home and School Association was similarly honored by the NCEA in 2004. Our test scores are uniformly high, and in 2003, Annunciation Catholic Academy was recognized by the U.S. Department of Education as a No Child Left Behind/Blue Ribbon School of Excellence. The award is given annually to schools whose standardized test scores are in the top 10 percent of the nation. Annunciation Catholic Academy continues to obtain qualifying scores each year. Our community's service efforts include filling a large tractor trailer with items that were needed by victims of the hurricane that struck the Gulf Coast states. Students, teachers, and administrators have welcomed children from New Orleans who lost their homes and moved to Orlando temporarily. A school in Mississippi that was in need of immediate supplies following a hurricane received the assistance of our school community. When the tsunami struck Sri Lanka, the principal began a fund to help rebuild a Catholic school in that country. Students enthusiastically became involved, and the school in Sri Lanka is being built. Each year school uniforms are donated to students in an orphanage in Jamaica and a mission in Nicaragua. Funds are currently being raised to build a school for children in the Dominican Republic.

Dr. Margaret Curran

Dr. Margaret E. Curran is the founding principal of Annunciation Catholic Academy, which was established in 1995. In 2004 Annunciation was proud to be the recipient of the No Child Left Behind Blue Ribbon School of Excellence. The US Department of Education honored the Academy's students' standardized test scores for being in the top ten percent of the nation.

Dr. Curran routinely presents at national and regional conferences and has been instrumental in forming the Forum for Catholic Elementary School Principals under the auspice of the National Catholic Educational Association (NCEA). She is president of the Department of Elementary Schools Executive

Committee of the NCEA and truly enjoys sharing experiences with educators across the country.

Afternoon Program—Proclaiming our Story: Around the eCampfire

Join Tim Welch and the Global Church Project Team for an afternoon to learn exciting and creative ways of Digital Storytelling.

The afternoon session will explore how stories have been passed down through the ages in order to define culture and to form faith. Join us for an overview of over 26,217 years of storytelling that uses the most appropriate tools for making our faith tradition known. Tim will help us understand how we can gather around the eCampfire with our faith stories.

The Global Project Team will share with us how they have engaged in a project to animate and connect secondary Religious Education (RE) students in Australia with their counterparts in the United States through the use of Information & Communication Technologies (ICT). In response to Pope Benedict's invitation to bear witness to your faith through the digital world, combined with the Church's **Year for Priests**, this project engages students in evangelization through research and presentation of the diverse facets of priestly ministry. Building on the enthusiasm generated in WYD08, these students will be provided with the opportunity to gain further appreciation of, and immersion in, the universal Church as they meet their fellow pilgrims from half-way around the world.

With more than 30 years of experience at both the parish and diocesan levels, he is constantly seeking ways of journeying with others to implement new technologies that can serve ministry and catechesis. He takes pride in working collaboratively in exploring new technologies when they seem promising but sometimes daunting.

Tim holds degrees in Theology and Religious Education from Saint John's University in Collegeville, MN, as well as in Electronics Engineering Technology from Savannah Tech in Savannah, GA. Tim credits much of his knowledge about faith and life from his three grown daughters and his spouse

of thirty-three years.

Tim is currently the National Consultant for Technology in Ministry for Our Sunday Visitor Curriculum Division, formerly Harcourt Religion Publishers.

First Section - eCampfire Stories and Songs

This section focuses on stories being spoken and sung through the ages around the campfire... and

how we can hear and tell our Story today through Podcasting, MP3 files and more! We will explore ways of harvesting audio from the Internet, and ways of creating our own audio stories. (Emphasis on orality/audio):

Second Section—The Global Church Project Team

The international team of students and faculty will share how they engaged in Digital Storytelling, highlighting the ministry stories of the priests interviewed during the Year of the Priest. They will also highlight how the students in Australia collaborated with their counterparts in the USA through the use of Information and Communication Technologies (ICT).

Third Section - eCampfire Illustrations and Illuminations

The campfire may be too dim for a close look at photos... but the eCampfire is not! This section will look at tools we can use to add graphical illustrations and illuminations to our stories, as well as exploring how others tell their stories through graphics and photos. (Emphasis on print and pictures)

Third Section - From the eCampfire to the eTheatre

We will look at how stories are told using video clips from various online resources such as YouTube, Vimeo and Wingclips plus video resources accessible through iTunes (for Windows and Macintosh). We will learn how to capture these clips for use in PowerPoint presentations, and even look at tools for creating our own video stories. (Emphasis on secondary orality/multimedia/video)

Fourth Section Wrap-up - Considerations for Digital Storytelling: Can OUR Story Go Viral?

If our digital natives speak the language of technology, shouldn't we be using that same language to echo our Story so they can hear it? Shouldn't we be using Digital Storytelling to engage our learners, and enable them to echo the Story themselves? This session will discuss who is telling their story well, how they are telling their story well, and what we should consider in telling our Story well... to the point of going "viral". (Emphasis on principals of creation, use and going viral)
